Anointing of the Sick:

Call the Parish Office in the event of illness or anticipated hospitalization.

Join us in a 1,730 mile “Virtual Pilgrimage” to Philadelphia for the World Meeting of Families. The idea is to get together to pray for some fit fun while we pray for families. A variety of events are currently planned. Every mile logged by participants in these local activities will be tallied weekly and our progress printed in the bulletin. If you already have an established group or routine join us in spirit by praying for strong and healthy families of every shape and size and call the office weekly with the total miles you or you and your group logged. Visit with friends, pray for families, and get fit! Such a deal!! We will celebrate our accomplishments with a photo opportunity with a Pope Francis poster at our Faith Formation Kick-Off in September.

Pilgrimage Progress. Collectively, parishioners who are participating in our virtual walk to Philadelphia for the World Synod on Families have journeyed (590+ miles). Participants have donated the miles they have walked, ran, swim, exercised and even knitted to our cause. (Every twenty minutes knitting is equal to a mile.) We have our way home secured thanks to one parish couple who has walked well over the 1700 miles themselves. As we continue our cross country training, therapy, walks, and knitting, may each stride, step, stroke and knot be an active prayer for families – especially those in most need. (PS: the trip to Rock Canyon was a blast! We will have to do this again!)

The total of miles logged as of August 9,2015 is 2,640. Not only have we secured the trip but we have also made great friends, prayed for families and continue to get fit!! Let’s keep up the great work!!

Many thanks to all those who have been so generously supporting our youth who are raising money for their real pilgrimage to Indianapolis in November for the National Conference for Catholic Youth (NCYC)! So far they have raised \$3,000.00 of their \$8,000 goal through monthly bake or burrito sales, car wash ticket sales, and the first in a series of Zumbathons. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. NCYC is a powerful spiritual experience for the tens of thousands of youth who gather for these days of prayer, inspiration, service and community. Let’s do our best to help our crew make it there.

More children will be joining the Order of Catechumens next weekend as we celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with them. This is their first big step on their journey to the waters of Baptism and we joyfully celebrate this decision with our prayerful support. The Rite will take place within the 10:15 Mass on Sunday, August 23.

We will begin with a blessing of catechists on Catechetical Sunday, September 20 and a Kick Off celebration and Orientation on Tuesday, September 22. Perhaps you’ve seen this story already. As far as I know it’s true, and not just the result of someone’s imagination. It expresses so well what Jesus was trying to do as he spoke about the need for people to be part of his life of grace. He was not pushing, pulling, condemning or cajoling. He was simply calling people to join him in relationship to his Father. And sometimes that happens through us.

Therefore the title of this story:

“Drawn Not by Wrath but by Love”

The author Ron Lee Dunn tells the story of two altar boys. One was born in 1892 in Eastern Europe. The other was born just three years later in a small town in Illinois. Though they lived very separate lives in very different parts of the world, these two altar boys had almost identical experiences. Each boy was given the opportunity to assist his parish priest in the service of communion. While handling the communion cup, they both accidentally spilled some of the wine on the carpet by the altar. There the similarity in their story ends.

The priest in the Eastern European church, seeing the purple stain, slapped the altar boy across the face and shouted, "Clumsy oaf! Leave the altar." The little boy grew up to become an atheist and a communist. His name was Marshall Josip Tito - dictator of Yugoslavia for 37 years.

The priest in the church in Illinois upon seeing the stain near the altar, knelt down beside the boy and looked him tenderly in the eyes and said, "It's alright son. You'll do better next time. You'll be a fine priest for God someday." That little boy grew up to become the much-loved Bishop Fulton J. Sheen.

There is the gospel! We are drawn, not by wrath and condemnation, but by love. God is love. God draws us by love. That’s what Jesus meant when he said, “No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me.”
